How to Revise Sentences

- **I. Show, don't tell!** Help readers picture your words in their minds by using adjectives and descriptive details.
- **2. Pump up the verbs.** Show actions in ways that grab your readers' attention.
- **3. Use linking words.** Mix up the length of your sentences. Try making some sentences longer or shorter. Combine two short sentences with words like *and* or *but*.

Grabbing a Bite

Sea turtles use their flippers as they swim through the ocean.
But experts recently made a discovery. They learned that some turtles catch dinner with them. A team of scientists studied underwater videos and photos of sea turtles from all over the world. They noticed sea turtles using their front flippers to find food. Some used them to find clams on the ocean floor. Others sweep bits of food into their mouths. Some turtles even held jellyfish in place while they took a bite. Scientists say it's a mystery how sea turtles learned these skills. They are interested in finding out more.
